

It's after school and two fifth form students are discussing their plans for summer.

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
Mentorship



I'm so glad CXCs are finally over and summer is almost here. I can't wait to just relax and do nothing


Me too! Although I won't be able to relax everyday as my summer job starts the first week in July

My mentor at church helped me find it.




A mentor is someone older and more experienced, who acts as a counsellor?
